THE GAME - The Sun Devils will conclude the 2019 campaign in the 86th Tony The Tiger Sun Bowl on Tuesday, Dec. 31 at Sun Bowl Stadium in El Paso, Texas. ASU will play in its 32nd bowl game overall and the team's eighth bowl appearance in the last nine seasons. It will be the Sun Devils' seventh overall appearance in the Sun Bowl, appearing in 1940, 1941, 1997, 2004, 2014 and 2017.

The 86th Tony The Tiger Sun Bowl will be played Tuesday, Dec. 31, at 12 noon MT (2:00 p.m. ET) at Sun Bowl Stadium. The game will be televised nationally on CBS, for the 52nd year, featuring teams from the ACC and the Pac-12 Conference. The game will be available over the local airwaves on Arizona Sports 98.7 FM. Arizona State will serve as the home team in the contest.

THE SEMINOLES - Florida State leads the overall series against the Sun Devils, 3-1, though the two programs have not played each other since 1984. The teams first met in the 1971 Fiesta Bowl before squaring off in Tampa in 1979 and playing in Tempe in 1983 and 1984. The Seminoles are 9-2 all-time against current members of the Pac-12. Florida State will appear in the postseason for an NCAA-best 38th time in the last 40 seasons. The Seminoles are returning to the Sun Bowl for the first time since 1966 and also played in the 1954 Sun Bowl, which was the second bowl appearance in program history.

KICKING OFF

- Kyle Williams has at least one pass reception in 40 consecutive games, good for fourth in ASU history and needing just one in the bowl game ti tie Derek Hagan for third.
- The win over Arizona marked the 11th time in 12 games that ASU held an opponent to 155 or fewer rushing yards (217 vs. UCLA). The Devils had just five such games last season. ASU had 11 total games including a bowl game accomplishing that feat in 2006, though only 10 in the regular season. ASU had 10 such games out of 11 regular season games in the 1996 season. It is the first time since the expansion to 12-game regular seasons that ASU has accomplished this feat.
- Jayden Daniels hasn't thrown an interception on 129 consecutive pass attempts, the fifth-longest active streak in the nation. That last interception, however, came on a half-ending Hail Mary attempt against Utah. With that removed, Daniels would have a streak of 197 consecutive passes without an interception over his last six games and change.
- The Devils have turned the ball over just 12 times this season the 10th-lowest total in the FBS. ASU is 11th nationally in turnover margin this season (0.83). ASU forced a turnover on 14.9 percent of opponent possessions this season, good for 18th nationally. ASU (11th in 2018) is one of just four teams nationally to rank in the Top-25 in turnover margin in each of the last two seasons (Georgia Southern, Syracuse, LSU) and only ASU and Syracuse have been in the Top-15 in the last two seasons.

AN ASU VICTORY WOULD...

- Be ASU's first bowl victory since the 2014 Sun Bowl win over Duke.
- Improve ASU to 15-16-1 all-time in bowl games.
- Be ASU's first three-game win streak to end a season since 2012 and be just the third time since joining the Pac-12 that the Sun Devils have accomplished the feat.
- Marks ASU's first season with at least eight victories since 2014.
- Improve ASU to 4-2-1 all-time in the Sun Bowl.

MILESTONE COUNTDOWNS

- 277 passing yards for Jayden Daniels to move into 10th in ASU single-season history (currently at 13th at 2,748 yards, behind Manny Wilkins' 3,025 in 2018).
- Less than 4 interceptions for Jayden Daniels to set the school record for fewest interceptions in a season on over 300 attempts (currently 2 on 310 behind Manny Wilkins' 6 on 393 attempts in 2018)
- 1 catch needed for Kyle Williams to move into third in ASU history in consecutive games with a reception (currently tied for fourth with 40 behind Derek Hagan's 41 straight games.).
- 5 catches needed for Kyle Williams to climb into sixth-place on ASU's All-Time career catches list (currently seventh at 159 behind Eric Guliford's 164).

#BYTHENUMBERS

Jermayne Lole recorded 68 tackles this season, the third most for a Sun Devil defensive lineman since 1990 behind only Shante Carver (79 in 1993) and Terrell Suggs (73 in 2002). He had the 12th-highest positive run impact score in the country at 23.6% among players graded as interior linemen (percentage of run defense snaps where player earned a positive grade from Pro Football Focus).Lole's 37 defensive stops this season led the nation's defensive interior linemen - two more than any other lineman in the nation. Lole was credited with just a single missed tackle this season, tied for fourth among FBS defensive linemen.

The Devils have turned the ball over just 12 times this season - the 10th-lowest total in the FBS. ASU is 11th nationally in turnover margin this season (0.83). ASU forced a turnover on 14.9 percent of opponent possessions this season, good for 18th nationally. ASU (11th in 2018) is one of just four teams nationally to rank in the Top-25 in turnover margin in each of the last two seasons (Georgia Southern, Syracuse, LSU). ASU's four interceptions thrown on the year are tied for the 4th-lowest total nationally. ASU is one of just five non-triple option offenses to rank in the Top-25 in fewest interceptions in the last two seasons.

In 11 of 12 games, the ASU defense has held an opponent to 155 or fewer rushing yards (217 vs. UCLA). The Devils had just 5 such games last season. ASU had 11 total games including a bowl game accomplishing that feat in 2006, though only 10 in the regular season. ASU had 10 such games out of 11 regular season games in the 1996 season. It is the first time since the expansion to 12-game regular seasons that ASU has accomplished this feat. ASU's rushing defense ranked 21st nationally at 116.8 yards per game - the best ranking at the end of the regular season since the 2009 Sun Devils were 19th (108.58 rushing yards per game).

The Sun Devils have given up just two plays over 50

yards this season, tied for the 5th-fewest nationally. ASU was also tied for 9th nationally in allowing just 3 plays of over 50 yards last year after sitting in the bottom 10 nationally in the previous four years. ASU's run defense has been especially efficient, currently 5th in the country with only 36 rushing plays allowed over 10 yards. In the last two seasons, the Sun Devil secondary has allowed just 13 total passing plays over 40 yards. For perspective, it had 12 alone in 2017, 22 in 2016 and 24 in 2015 – the latter two ranked second to last and last, respectively, in the nation.

Among safeties with at least 200 snaps on run defense, Aashari Crosswell was not credited with a missed tackle on a running play this season, marking him the only safety in the country to lay such a claim. **His one missed tackle on the season, period, was tied for first among over 300 FBS safeties in the country.** Aashari Crosswell was the 15th-highest graded defender in the Pac-12 with his score of 76.1 while fellow safety Cam Phillips was the 24th-ghest graded defender in the league (73.4). Both safeties earned a spot on the Pro Football Focus Pac-12 All-Conference team.

Jayden Daniels hasn't thrown an interception in 129 consecutive pass attempts, tied for the fifth-longest active streak in the nation. The last interception, however, came on a halfending Hail Mary attempt against Utah. With that removed, Daniels would have a streak of 197 consecutive passes without an interception over his last six games and change. The third-longest streak in ASU history without an interception was Mike Pagel (136) in 1980 and the school record is Rudy Carpenter's streak of 146 straight in 2005 (Manny Wilkins went 145 straight in 2017). Daniels is easily on pace to set the ASU school record for fewest interceptions with over 300 attempts (currently Wilkins' 6 in 393 in 2018).

2. ASU's 4 interceptions thrown on the year are tied for the 4th-lowest total nationally. ASU is one of just five non-triple option offenses to rank in the Top-25 in fewest interceptions in the last two seasons.

3. In 11 of 12 games, the ASU defense has held an opponent to 155 or fewer rushing yards (217 vs. UCLA). The Devils had just 5 such games last season. It is the first time since the expansion to 12-game regular seasons that ASU has accomplished this feat.

 Aashari Crosswell (@YkgAashari) has been credited with just one missed tackle this season, a total that leads the nation's 300+ graded safeties.

5. .@jayd__5 has not thrown an interceptions in 129 consecutive pass attempts, the 8th longest active streak in the country. He needs 17 more to set the ASU school record in the category.

6. The Sun Devils have given up just two plays over 50 yards this season, tied for the 5th-fewest nationally. It was 9th in the category last season (3) after being ranked in the bottom-10 nationally in the 4 previous seasons.

7. Senior wide receiver @kylewilliamsVI has caught at least one pass in 40 consecutive games, dating back to his freshman season - good for fourth in ASU history and the fourth-longest active streak in the FBS.

8. Chase Lucas has been credited just just one touchdown against him in coverage this season, tied for 18th among the nation's corners and second in the Pac-12.

9. Jermayne Lole recorded 68 tackles this season, the third most for a Sun Devil defensive lineman since 1990 behind only Shante Carver (79 in 1993) and Terrell Suggs (73 in 2002).

10. The Sun Devils are looking to end the season on a three-game winning streak for just the third time since joining the Pac-12 (1978 and 2012).



FOCUSING ON FOOTBALL

- Pro Football Focus named eight Sun Devils to its All-Pac-12 team following the season: Brandon Aiyuk (First Team WR/PR, Second Team KR), Eno Benjamin (First Team RB), Michael Turk (First Team P), Dohnovan West (Third Team OG), Jermayne Lole (Second Team ED), Kobe Williams (Third Team CB), Aashari Crosswell (Second Team S), Cam Phillips (Honorable Mention S)
- » The Sun Devil defense featured four players ranked among the Top-25 in the Pac-12 in overall defensive grading from Pro Focus Football.
- » Among Pac-12 players with at least 550 snaps, Kobe Williams was the 8th-highest graded defender in the league, regardless of position with a score of 82.4. He was the 29th highest graded corner overall in the country and the 30th-highest graded corner in coverage specifically (81.9)
- » Aashari Crosswell was the 15th-highest graded defender in the Pac-12 with his score of 76.1 while fellow safety Cam Phillips was the 24th-ghest graded defender in the league (73.4).
- » Additionally, Jermayne Lole checked in as the 16th-highest graded player in the Pac-12 with a score of 75.6 the second-highest score among edge defenders in the league. His 81.9 score on running plays this season was 31st among edge defenders nationally.
- » Brandon Aiyuk was ASU's highest graded offensive player this season, finishing as the 9th-highest graded offensive player in the Pac-12 and third-highest graded wide receiver (81.4) 36th among all wide receivers nationally. He was named to Pro Football Focus' Pac-12 first team Offensive Team of the Year and a first team punt returner. He was a second-team selection as as a kick returner. He was the third-highest graded punt returner in the nation in the regular season.
- » Among offensive players with at least 600 snaps, Eno Benjamin was the 26th-highest graded offensive player in the league (74.1). He was named to Pro Football Focus' first team Pac-12 Offensive Team of the Year.
- » Frank Darby was the Pac-12's seventh-highest graded wide receiver (72.2) among players with 600 snaps and also did his part off the ball in recording the 13th-highest score in the FBS among receivers as a run blocker (82.3).
- » Despite being one of less than 20 true freshman offensive linemen to start every game in the country, Dohnovan West was 6th-highest graded guard in the Pac-12 this season (69.0).

DAAAAMMNNNN DANIELS

- » Following the regular season, Jayden Daniels sat in the Top-30 in passing efficiency (19th, 153.5), passing yards per game (28th, 249.8), and total offense (24th, 278.1)
- » Daniels was 15th nationally and second in the Pac-12 in pass yards per completion (14.24) while his 8.86 yards per pass attempt are 13th in the FBS and third in the league.
- » He had a 106.2 NFL quarterback rating, good for 22nd nationally, while his 153.5 NCAA passing efficiency was 19th.
- » Among quarterbacks with at least 200 attempts, Daniels was tied for the second-fewest interceptions nationally behind Ohio State's Justin Fields with just two - one of which coming on a half-ending Hail Mary attempt against Utah.
- Daniels hasn't thrown an interception in 129 consecutive pass attempts, tied for the fifth-longest active streak in the nation. The last interception, however, came on a half-ending Hail Mary attempt against Utah. With that removed, Daniels would have a streak of 197 consecutive passes without an interception over his last six games and change. The third-longest streak in ASU history without an interception was Mike Pagel (136) in 1980 and the school record is Rudy Carpenter's streak of 146 straight in 2005 (Manny Wilkins went 145 straight in 2017). Daniels is easily on pace to set the ASU school record for fewest interceptions with over 300 attempts (currently Wilkins' 6 in 393 in 2018).
- » Since 1960, there have been only three instances of a quarterback throwing fewer than five interceptions on the season: Ron Cosner (3 on just 56 attempts in 1960), John Goodman (4 on just 175 attempts in 1965) and Rudy Carpenter (2 on 228 attempts in 2005). Daniels is at two on 310 pass attempts this season.
- » Pro Football Focus credited Daniels with just seven turnover-worthy throws this season, the 16th-lowest total nationally.
- » Daniels was 8th in the country with 15 pass completions over 40 yards this season and 12th in the FBS with 24 passes over 30 yards. His eight completions over 50 yards were 10th.
- » 11 of his 17 touchdowns passes this season have gone for at least 25 yards (64.7 percent).

ICE IN HIS VEINS

- » Jayden Daniels has shown poise beyond his years in high-pressure situations this season.
- » Daniels was exceptional on third downs this season, with his 744 passing yards on third downs good for 17th in the country (despite missing a game). His 160.13 passer rating on third down was 25th nationally.
- » Despite missing a game, Daniels accounted for 784 passing yards in the fourth quarter of games, good for 10th nationally while his 34 passing first downs were also 10th. He recorded 9 fourth quarter passing touchdowns (fourth nationally) to one interception. His 183.84 QB efficiency rating in the fourth quarter was 12th in the country.
- » He completed 11 passes of 25+ yards in the fourth quarter of games (tied for 2nd nationally) and his 19 pass completions over 15 yards in the frame were tied for 11th.

- » While under pressure this season, Daniels posted the 6th-highest NFL passer rating of any quarterback in the FBS at 97.2. For reference, the national average was 68.6.
- » Daniel had a 69.0 accuracy rating under pressure, the 5th-best tally in the country. He had five touchdown passes under pressure, tied for 21st nationally while his 627 yards were 25th.
- » Daniels did his part to escape pressure as shown by his 60 QB scrambles this season, a total that was second among FBS quarterbacks.

NOT YOUR AVERAGE FRESHMAN

- » Jayden Daniels became the first true freshman quarterback in program history to start the first game of the season.
- » At 2,748 passing yards, Daniels has easily surpassed Rudy Carpenter's previous freshman school record of 2,273 yards. Daniels total is 13th in school history with the bowl game remaining.
- » Daniels broke the Sun Devil record for passing yards in a first career game with 284 season opener, which was previously 160 by Jeff Krohn in 2000. This record was broken seven games later by teammate Joey Yellen, who through for 292 in his debut against USC.
- » Daniels became the third freshman in ASU history to win his first career start, joining John Walker (1984) and Dennis Sproul (1974) as the only other QB's to win their first career starts as freshmen.
- With his 72-yard touchdown pass to Eno Benjamin in the fourth quarter against Sacramento State, Daniels became the first ASU quarterback ever to throw a touchdown pass over 70 yards in consecutive games (had a 77-yard pass to Brandon Aiyuk in Week One).
- » Only 12 times in ASU history has a freshman quarterback recorded a 300+ yard passing performance, of which Daniels now has five. His five 300+ yard performances are tied with Andrew Walter (2004) and Rudy Carpenter (2005) for the most in a single season in ASU history.

HOLD ON TO YOUR SEATS

- » Arizona State has played in 10 total games decided by four points or less in the Herm Edwards era, which is tied with San Diego State for the most in the FBS over the last two seasons.
- » ASU has seven wins in games decided by four points or less (7-3 record), tied for third behind Texas (10) and Nevada (9) for the most wins by four points or fewer in the last two seasons.
- » The Sun Devils have now played in 16 games decided by a touchdown or less in the last two years, going 8-8 in that time. The 16 games are tied with Texas for the most in the country during that time.
- » ASU has played seven games this season decided by a touchdown or less six of which decided by four points or less.

HOLD ON TO THAT BALL, ALSO

- The Devils have turned the ball over just 12 times this season the 10th-lowest total in the FBS. ASU is 11th nationally in turnover margin this season (0.83). ASU forced a turnover on 14.9 percent of opponent possessions this season, good for 18th nationally.
- » ASU (11th in 2018) is one of just four teams nationally to rank in the Top-25 in turnover margin in each of the last two seasons (Georgia Southern, Syracuse, LSU) and only ASU and Syracuse have been in the Top-15 in the last two seasons.
- » ASU's four interceptions thrown on the year are tied for the 4th-lowest total nationally. ASU is one of just five non-triple option offenses to rank in the Top-25 in fewest interceptions in the last two seasons joining Auburn as the only other one of those to do so with a different primary quarterback in each of those seasons.
- » ASU has collected 13 fumble recoveries this season, the third-most in the nation and the most since finishing the 2014 season with 13. ASU had 17 fumble recoveries during the 2011 season. It had one against Oregon State, the first fumble lost by the Beavers all season in its first 10 games.
- » ASU has outscored opponents 747-379 in points off takeaways since 2012. ASU has padded that stat this season, outscoring the opposition 62-24.
- » Since 2012, ASU has scored 65.8 percent of the time following an opponent turnover (125 of 190) while finding the end zone 92 times in that span (48.4 percent).
- » Conversely, opponents have scored just 50.0 percent of the time following an ASU turnover since 2012 (64 of 128) with 49 touchdowns (38.3 percent).

LOCKING IT DOWN

- The Sun Devils have given up just two plays over 50 yards this season, tied for the 5th-fewest nationally. ASU was also tied for 9th nationally in allowing just 3 plays of over 50 yards last year after sitting in the bottom 10 nationally in the previous four years.
- » ASU's eight plays allowed over 40 yards this season are 14th nationally. In 2018, ASU was tied for 11th nationally in allowing just 8 plays over 40 yards, an area the Devils had struggled in in previous seasons (allowing 20, 16, 30, 21 in the previous four seasons and finishing 103rd, 79th, 128th, 110th, respectively).

- ASU has allowed just 15 plays over 30 yards this season, a total tied for 6th nationally. In 2018, The Devils gave up just 22 plays over 30 yards, tied for 34th-fewest nationally. In the previous four years, ASU had given up 38, 44, 40, 40 such plays, ranked 116th, 124th, 117th and 119th.
- ASU's run defense has been especially efficient, currently 5th in the country with only 36 rushing plays allowed over 10 yards this season. With just 7 rushing plays over 20 yards allowed this season, ASU is 7th in the country.
- » In the last two seasons, the Sun Devil secondary has allowed just 13 total passing plays over 40 yards. For perspective, it had 12 alone in 2017, 22 in 2016 and 24 in 2015 the latter two ranked second to last and last, respectively, in the nation.
- » ASU's defense has done it's part to limit opponents on short-field drives (drives beginning less than 60 yards for the end zone), holding teams to 3.09 points per drive in such situations (36th in the country).

KEEP 'EM OFF THE BOARD

- ASU was 39th in the country and fifth in the Pac-12 in allowing just 23.1 points per game. The Sun Devils allowed just 25.5 points per game last season, good for 53rd nationally. The totals are notable as ASU was 103rd nationally at 32.8 points per game allowed in 2017 and had finished 99th or worse in three consecutive seasons prior to the marked improvement the past two seasons.
- » ASU has been able to close games strong, allowing just 10.0 second half points per game against FBS opponents, good for 20th in the nation. At just 5.3 points allowed per fourth quarter, ASU sits tied for 25th nationally and third in the Pac-12.
- » Finishing halves has been the forte with ASU allowing just 6.0 points per second quarter this season, good for 29th nationally holding opponents scoreless in the quarter in six of those frames this year.
- » ASU has held five opponents under 20 points this year, its most since holding six under the mark in 2012.
- » ASU has held opponents to 30 or less points in 16 of 25 games under Herm Edwards, notable as it DID allow 30+ in 32 of 43 previous games dating back in a span from 2013-17.

NO FLY ZONE

- » Kobe Williams was the 8th-highest graded defender in the league, regardless of position with a score of 82.4. He was the 29th highest graded corner overall in the country and the 30th-highest graded corner in coverage specifically (81.9).
- » Williams was thrown at just 34 times this season the 18th-lowest total among corners in the country. He was targeted just once every 9.1 snaps in coverage this season, 11th-lowest among the nation's corners.
- » Williams allowed just 198 yards in coverage, the 16th-lowest total among the nation's corners. His 0.64 yards allowed per coverage snap was 16th.
- » He allowed just 18 receptions this season, which was the fewest in the Pac-12 and 24th-fewest nationally. Wiliams' one reception allowed for every 17.1 snaps played in coverage was second in the Pac-12 and 27th nationally.
- » Williams' 77.1 NFL passer rating when targeted this season was 6th in the Pac-12.
- » Chase Lucas allowed just one touchdown in coverage this season, the second-lowest total in the Pac-12 and 18th-lowest total nationally.
- » Jack Jones was tied for ninth nationally with 16 passes defended on the season and his 1.33 passes defended per game were 12th in the country.
- » Jones' five pass breakups against Washington State are the most by an FBS player this season. He was a part of 12 pass breakups by the Sun Devils the fifth highest total in the FBS this season and the first time ASU posted 10 or more since 2011.
- $\,$ > The Sun Devils had 65 passes defended in 2019, the 12th-highest total in the nation and the most since posting 75 in 2012.

MIDDLE OF THE LINE-UP

- » Khayan Kearse-Thomas led the team in tackles for loss with 11 the most among non-edge rushing linebackers in the Pac-12 – and finished with 57 total tackles.
- » He was eighth among Pac-12 linebackers with 36 defensive stops this season.
- » Part of five sacks this season, Kearse-Thomas tied for first among Pac-12 linebackers.
- In coverage, opponents had the fifth-lowest NFL QB rating against Kearse-Thomas out of all linebackers in the league and the 10th-lowest complete percentage in the league.
 Among all linebackers and odes definition in the league.
- » Among all linebackers and edge defenders in the Pac-12, he recorded the 16th-best positive run impact percentage at 13.6%.
- » Darien Butler was the seventh-highest graded linebacker in the Pac-12 on run defense, according to Pro Football Focus, while his 18 total quarterback pressures were tied for eighth among the league's linebackers
- » Merlin Robertson was credited with just eight missed tackles this season, the second-fewest among the Pac-12 linebackers this season

SAFETY VALVE

- » Aashari Crosswell was the 15th-highest graded defender in the Pac-12 with his score of 76.1 while fellow safety Cam Phillips was the 24th-ghest graded defender in the league (73.4).
- » Among safeties with at least 200 snaps on run defense, Crosswell was not been credited with a missed tackle on a running play this season, marking him the only safety in the country to lay such a claim.
- » His one missed tackle on the season, period, was tied for first among over 300 FBS safeties in the country.
- » Evan Fields had 21 total defensive "stops" this season, a total that was tied for second among safeties in the Pac-12.
- » On run defense this season, Fields has recorded 15 total defensive "stops" to lead all Pac-12 safeties and 35th nationally. His 5.5 run-stop percentage also leads the league and is 22nd in the FBS among safeties with over 250 run snaps.
- » When he plays within eight yards of the line of scrimmage at the snap, Fields has recorded a 7.0 run stop percentage - highest among Pac-12 safeties and 15th in the FBS among safeties with at least 200 run plays beginning within 8 yards of the line of scrimmage.

LO-LEEEEEE, LOLE, LOLE, LOLEEEE

- » Jermayne Lole checked in as the 16th-highest graded player in the Pac-12 with a score of 75.6 the second-highest score among edge defenders in the league. His 81.9 score on running plays this season was 31st among edge defenders nationally.
- » Lole recorded 68 tackles this season, the third most for a Sun Devil defensive lineman since 1990 behind only Shante Carver (79 in 1993) and Terrell Suggs (73 in 2002).
- » The sophomore had the 12th-highest positive run impact score in the country at 23.6 percent among players graded as interior linemen (percentage of run defense snaps where player earned a positive grade from Pro Football Focus).
- » Lole's 37 defensive stops this season led the nation's defensive interior linemen two more than any other lineman in the nation.
- » Lole was credited with just a single missed tackle this season, tied for fourth among FBS defensive linemen.

BIG PLAY FRANK

- Frank Darby Hauled in a touchdown pass in four straight games in the back half of the season and accounted for two touchdowns in three of those outings. He had seven touchdowns over the fourgame span (UCLA-USC-Oregon State-Oregon). Prior to the UCLA game, he had five total receiving touchdowns in his previous 30 career games to that current four-game stretch.
- » In those four games, he had 16 catches for 387 yards (24.2 yards per catch) and seven touchdowns.
- » His 125-yard performance in the upset victory over No. 6 Oregon was the fifth 100+ yard game of his career.
- » The epitome of a deep threat, 24 of Darby's 58 career catches (41%) have gone for 20 or more yards.
- » Darby's 21.32 yards per reception this season was third in the country and second among Pac-12 receivers.
- » Frank Darby has continued to climb the Pac-12's offensive grading chart, checking in as the Pac-12's seventh-highest graded wide receiver (72.2) among players with 600 snaps and also did his part off the ball in recording the 13th-highest score in the FBS among receivers as a run blocker (82.3).
- » When targeted this season, Darby posted a 143.4 NFL quarterback rating (28-47 catches for 597 yards with eight touchdowns and no interceptions) good for the 12th-highest total among all wide receivers nationally.

NOBODY'S BUSINESS BUT THE TURKS

- » He pinned 32 of those 59 punts inside the opponent 20-yard line (54.2 percent), a total that was second in the nation.
- » Turk has 21 punts out of 59 (35.6 percent) punts over 50 yards this season, six more than any other player in the Pac-12.
- » Turk holds the top mark in the FBS this season for max hang time on a punt with a mark of 5.51 seconds in generally unfavorable conditions in Week 8 against Utah. Pro Football Focus has given Turk the 10th-highest grade among FBS punters this season that played at least 10 games.
- The 63.0 yards per punt mark by Turk on Aug. 29 vs. Kent State broke an NCAA record. The previous record for highest average yards per punt in a game with minimum five attempts was Braden Mann of Texas A&M on Sept. 22, 2018, as he had a 60.8 yards per punt average vs. Alabama on punts of 56, 65, 62, 61 and 60 for 304 yards. Turks punted five times for 315 yards with boots of 64, 62, 65, 49 and 75 in his Sun Devil debut.
- » Turk crushed Sun Devils school records for punting average, breaking the previous school record for average on five punts of 55.0 by Danny White in 1972. Turk's 63.0 yards per punt would have set

records for every minumum number of punts in a game with the closest being Tony Lorick's 59.3 yards per punt on three punts in 1962.

» Turk's 75-yarder to in the opener was tied for the seventh-longest punt in school history and the fifth-longest punt in the FBS this season.

KEEPING MOMENTUM

- » The Sun Devils have won as least seven games in six of the last eight seasons.
- Sun Devil Football has had one of the top home field advantages in the FBS in recent history, recording a 40-14 record at Sun Devil Stadium since 2012. The 40 wins are tied for 21st nationally in that time while the 14 losses are the 28th-fewest in the FBS since 2012.
- » The Sun Devils had a streak of scoring double-digit points in 125 consecutive games ended against Utah, matching the longest streak in the modern era of FBS football with Lousiana Tech (125 straight games from 2008-2018).
- » ASU also had the FBS' longest active streak of consecutive games scoring more than 7 points ended at 140 straight games in that Utah contest. The Sun Devils had last scored fewer than 7 points when they were shutout, 28-0, against eighth-ranked USC in the 2008 season. They have scored 30 or more points in 77 of those games (55.0 percent).

THE KIDS WILL BE ALRIGHT

- » All told, 32 true or redshirt freshmen have played for the Sun Devils this year (21 true, 11 redshirt). That is tied for the third-highest total among FBS programs this season behind Clemson and Oklahoma.
- » Eight true freshmen have started a game for ASU, tied for the second-highest total in the nation behind Alabama (9). ASU's 5 offensive true freshmen to start a game this season are the most of any team in the country.
- » Overall, ASU has 40 true freshmen on the roster (sixth in the FBS) and 13 redshirt freshmen. The 54 total freshmen equates to 52.5 percent of ASU's roster of 101 - the fourth-highest percentage of a roster in the FBS behind only Oklahoma State (57.1), UCLA (52.8) and Virginia Tech (52.5)
- » The Sun Devils played 25 freshmen in the season opener (15 true, 10 redshirt) the most ever in the modern era at ASU. That was the third-highest total in the country behind only Clemson (38 -27/11) and Baylor (35 - 20/15).
- » Jayden Daniels became the first TRUE freshman quarterback to start for the Sun Devils on Opening Day in ASU's modern era (freshmen became eligible to play in 1972).
- » Daniels is just the sixth true freshman to start any game at quarterback in ASU history, joining Dillon Sterling-Cole (2016), Brock Osweiler (2009), Jake Plummer (1993), John Walker (1984) and Dennis Sproul (1974).
- For the first time in program history, a freshman was named a team captain after Herm Edwards dubbed true freshman quarterback/athlete Ethan Long as special teams captain before the season. Additionally, Darien Butler will be the first true sophomore captain in program history after the linebacker was named captain for the team's defense. Prior to this season, no player that had been with the program for less than three years had ever been named a team captain in ASU history.
- » Arizona State is the only team in the country starting two true freshmen on its offensive line.

ALL ABOUT THE BENJAMINS

- » Eno Benjamin was 4th in the Pac-12 with 10 rushing touchdowns this season. His 12 touchdowns were fifth in the league and 37th nationally. He was 4th in the league with 119.17 all-purpose yards per game.
- » Benjamin recorded 15 career games with at least 100 rushing yards good for 4th in program history. He also had 18 career games in which he reached century mark in total all-purpose yards.
- We had at least one touchdown (rushing or receiving) in 18 games in his career. He had 27 career rushing touchdowns, only one shy of cracking the Top-5 in program history despite receiving the majority of his snaps in just two seasons. The junior had 32 total touchdowns (27 rushing, 4 receiving, and 1 blocked return) in his career.
- » Benjamin continued to do his part to make people miss this year, forcing 72 missed tackles this season a total tied for 10th nationally among running backs. He was 22nd nationally with 739 yards after contact this season (68.2 percent of his 1,083 rushing yards).
- » He had 2,867 rushing yards in his career and sits in seventh-place on the school's all-time rushing list.
- » He rushed for 19 first downs this season when the team is facing third down tied for 12th nationally among FBS running backs.
- » He helped rally the offense when attempting to come back, recording 22 rushing first downs when the team was trailing by 7 or fewer points - the second-highest total nationally - while his seven rushing touchdowns while trailing by a touchdown or less were first in the FBS and his 354 yards in the situation are 8th nationally.
- » Benjamin played 341 snaps in passing routes this season, the second-highest total among FBS running backs while his 56 targets were fourth. He was targetted on 21.6 percent of ASU aimed passes (balls not thrown away, spiked or batted) the 15th-highest percentage of running backs

nationally.

»

- His 347 receiving yards this season were sixth among all FBS running backs and his 42 receptions were tied for fifth in the nation.
- Benjamin became the 20th Sun Devil in program history to reach 2,000 rushing yards with his effort against Colorado. The junior has 2,867 rushing yards in his career and is one of just five three-year players to find themselves in the 2,000-yard club (Mario Bates, Ben Malone, Art Malone and Woody Green). Benjamin also joined the all-purpose 3,000-yard club this year (3,620) as he eclipsed the 3K all-purpose yards mark for his career against Utah.

BRANDON AI-YAC

- WR Brandon Aiyuk was second in the FBS in yards after the catch with 710 while his 10.9 yards after the catch per reception were the 12th-most nationally. He was first in the Pac-12 with 3.04 yards per route run on the season.
- » Aiyuk's 1,192 receiving yards this season were fifth in ASU single season history and he was within 18 of fourth and 56 of third.
- » When targeted, Aiyuk helped his quarterbacks record a 133.9 NFL QB rating the 10th-best total in the country among team's primary receivers that receive the majority of the targets.
- » Aiyuk was 8th nationally and 2nd in the Pac-12 with 1,192 receiving yards on the year while his 99.3 receiving yards per game were also 13th in the FBS and second in the league.
- » Six of his eight touchdown receptions in 2019 were for more than 30 yards (77 yards vs. Kent State, 53 yards vs. Colorado, 40 yards vs. WSU, 86 yards vs. WSU, 33 yards vs. WSU, 81 vs. ORE).
- » He was one of just three receivers with two 80+ yard receiving touchdowns this year (Arkansas State's Omar Baylesss and Louisville's Chatarius Atwell). His six catches over 50 yards were second in nation while his nine 40+ yard catches were third and three 70+ grabs were second. His 12 catches over 30 yards were good for sixth.
- » At 18.34 yards per reception, Aiyuk was third in the Pac-12 and 34th nationally in the category. His average LONG reception per game this season was an incredible 44.3 yards.
- » Aiyuk had three games this season with 150+ receiving yards, tied for fourth in ASU career history.
- » Aiyuk's 86-yard touchdown reception against Washington State was the longest passing play/score by a Sun Devil since Demario Richard's 93-yard catch and run against New Mexico in 2015. It was the eighth-longest catch in ASU history.
- » His 196 total receiving yards in the Washington State contest with the 11th-most in Sun Devil history. His 28.0 yard per catch average in the game was easily the highest single-game per-catch average of a Sun Devil recording seven catches in a game, passing N'Keal Harry's previous record of 24.3 in 2017. It was the highest yards-per-catch average in a single game for any receiver in ASU history with 7 or more catches in a game.

ALL-PURPOSE AIYUK

- Brandon Aiyuk was 6th nationally and first in the Pac-12 in all-purpose yards at 155.83 per game - the most for any wide receiver in the country.
- » He is over 2,000 all-purpose yards (2,725) in his career at ASU despite being in Tempe for just two seasons.
- » Aiyuk racked up 1,870 all-purpose yards this season (sixth nationally) on just 94 total plays (19.9 yards per touch, which was fourth nationally). The five players ahead of Aiyuk were all running backs and each had at least 245 total touches this season.
- » Among the Top-15 players nationally in total yards, no other player was within 8 yards per touch of Aiyuk's 19.9 tally (Maryland's Javon Leake at 11.3, all others below 10.0).
- » Aiyuk was the only player in the country to record at least 200 yards on both punt (226) and kick (446) returns. His 226 punt return yards were 11th in the country.
- » Aiyuk collected 293 (173 receiving, 76 punt return, 44 kick return) all-purpose yards against Oregon State, the fifth-most in single-game program history and eighth-most by player in the FBS this season.
- » Aiyuk had eight performances with 100+ all-purpose yards this season and 12 of his career. He eclipsed 200 all-purpose yards for the fifth time in his career and for the third consecutive game against Oregon. He had 727 all-purpose yards in that three-game stretch (220, 293, 214).
- » At 1,870 all-purpose yards this season, Aiyuk is fourth in ASU history and within 195 yards of Wilford White's long-standing school record of 2,065 set back in 1950.





HERM EDWARDS

14-11 (SECOND SEASON)

Former NFL head coach and ESPN Analyst Herm Edwards was named the 24th head coach of Sun Devil Football, as announced by Arizona State University and Vice President of University Athletics Ray Anderson on December 3, 2017.

Edwards arrived in Tempe with a football legacy that has impacted thousands, whether as a player, coach, analyst, motivational speaker and author, or community advocate and philanthropist.

In just two years with the Sun Devils, Edwards has recorded five wins over Top-25 ranked programs in addition to recording 14 wins and becoming just the third coach in program history to defeat rival Arizona in each of his first two seasons at Arizona State.

In his second year at the helm of the Sun Devils, the trajectory of the program continued to curve upward with ASU going 3-1 over top Top-25 teams – two of which coming on the road at No. 6 Michigan State and No. 15 Cal before shaking up the college football landscape with a momentous victory over No. 6 Oregon at Sun Devil Stadium in the penultimate week of the regular season.

Three times during the 2019 season, Edwards was tabbed as the Dodd Trophy National Coach of the Week from the organization that annually awards its namesake trophy to the top coach in college football.

Edwards' 2019 offense has been highlighted by another exceptional season from Pac-12 First Team running back Eno Benjamin, who has posted consecutive 1,000-yard seasons for the first time at ASU since Freddie Williams in the 1970s. Benjamin has 2,867 rushing yards in his career and now sits in seventh-place on the school's all-time rushing list.

For the third consecutive season, the Sun Devils also lay claim to a 1,000-yard receiver with Pac-12 First Team receiver and returner Brandon Aiyuk finishing the regular season 8th nationally and 2nd in the Pac-12 with 1,192 receiving yards on the year while his 99.3 receiving yards per

game are also 13th in the FBS and second in the league.

At the helm of the Sun Devil offense has been true freshman sensation Jayden Daniels. The first true freshman to start a season at quarterback in ASU history, Daniels sits in the Top-30 in in the FBS in passing efficiency (19th, 153.5), passing yards per game (28th, 249.8), and total offense (24th, 278.1). At 2,748 passing yards, Daniels has easily surpassed Rudy Carpenter's previous freshman school record of 2,273 yards.

The Sun Devil defense has continued to see exceptional improvements under Edwards and defensive coordinator Danny Gonzales. ASU finished the regular season 39th in scoring defense, allowing just 23.1 points per game – notables as the Sun Devils had finished 99th or worse in three consecutive seasons prior to Gonzales taking the reins on the defensive end.

The rushing defense has been stingy for the Sun Devils, ranked 21st nationally in allowing just 116.8 yards per game – the best ranking at the end of the regular season for ASU since the 2009 Sun Devils were 19th (108.58 rushing yards per game).

Edwards and his coaching staff exceeded expectations during his first year in charge of the program, garnering national attention for several noteworthy achievements. ASU earned several significant victories under Edwards' watch, including a pair of Top-25 wins in Sun Devil Stadium over No. 15 Michigan State and No. 16 Utah.

Edwards' first season culminated with an appearance against No. 21 Fresno State in the Las Vegas Bowl. Combined with ASU's wins at USC and vs. UCLA, Edwards became the only first-year coach in program history to defeat UA, USC and UCLA and make a bowl game.

Under Edwards and his coaching staff, several players enjoyed breakout seasons. Arizona State and Clemson weres the only Power-5 program to have a 3,000-yard passer (Manny Wilkins), a 1,000-yard receiver (N'Keal Harry), and a 1,500-yard rusher (Eno Benjamin) in 2018.

With running the ball becoming a priority, Benjamin made a jump from freshman to sophomore year that put him on the radar of NFL Scouts and National Award Lists. Benjamin finished his first season as a starter with a Pac-12 best 1,642 rushing yards and 16 rushing touchdowns.

Wide receiver N'Keal Harry had another dominating season at the wide receiver position. Harry had NFL scouts flocking to Sun Devil Stadium to see the NFL prospect operate in Edwards' NFL-style system. Harry was drafted by New England in the first round of last April's NFL Draft.

The Sun Devil defense was one of the most improved thanks to Coach Edwards and his defensive coordinator, Danny Gonzales. The defense allowed just 25.5 points per game in 2018, tying them for 50th nationally, a tremendous improvement from 2017 when ASU finished 103rd (32.8 ppg).

Linebacker Merlin Robertson was named the 2018 Pac-12 Defensive Freshman of the Year, becoming the first true freshman to lead the Sun Devils in tackles (77) since 2001.

Edwards spent eight years as an NFL head coach with the New York Jets (2001-05) and Kansas City Chiefs (2006-08). He led his teams to four playoff appearances, including 2004 when his Jets squad finished with a 10-6 regular season record and advanced to the AFC Divisional Playoffs. Edwards, who also guided the Chiefs to a Wild Card berth in 2006, is one of only four NFL coaches to lead two different teams to the playoffs in his first season as head coach with those teams.

Among the numerous players that Edwards coached in his career include Pro Football Hall of Famers Curtis Martin, Warren Sapp, Derrick Brooks, Kevin Mawae and Tony Gonzalez and numerous All-Pro players including as Larry Johnson, Ronde Barber, John Lynch, Jared Allen, Santana Moss, Tamba Hali, Derrick Johnson.

Prior to his appointment at ASU, Edwards spent eight years as an NFL analyst for ESPN where he appeared primarily on NFL Live, SportsCenter, ESPN Radio, and the network's coverage of Super Bowl week. For six years of that stretch Edwards also served as a coach at the Under Armour All-American game, which features the top high school football recruits in the country.

An undrafted free agent who went on to have a 10-year NFL career, Edwards never missed a game in his nine seasons with the Philadelphia Eagles from 1977 to 1985 and started all 16 games in seven of his nine seasons with the team. Over the course of his nine years in Philadelphia, Edwards totaled 38 interceptions -- with seven during his sophomore NFL season – which is just one short of the franchise record. He earned second-team All-NFC honors in 1980 to help lead the Eagles to Super Bowl XV.

Edwards retired from the NFL following the 1986 season, and as the first graduate of the league's Minority Coaching Fellowship, he immediately went into coaching as a defensive assistant at San Jose State University from 1987 to 1989.

In 1990, Edwards transitioned back into the NFL as a scout and defensive backs coach with the Chiefs from 1990 to 1995 under legendary head coach Marty Schottenheimer. He then served under Tony Dungy with the Tampa Bay Buccaneers from 1996-2000 before being hired as the head coach for the New York Jets in January 2001.

Over the course of five seasons Edwards led the Jets to three playoff berths, five postseason contests and a pair of 10-win seasons. His 35 victories with the team from 2001-04 is tied with Joe Walton (1983-86) for the most regular season wins by a coach in his first four years with the team.

He started his second tour with the Kansas City Chiefs in 2006 and became the first coach in franchise history to lead the team to the playoffs in his initial season.

Edwards played cornerback for the University of California in 1972 and 1974 before he ended his collegiate career at San Diego State in 1975.

A native of Seaside, Calif., Edwards graduated from Monterey High School, attended the University of California, Berkeley for two years, with a stint at Monterey Peninsula College, before graduating from San Diego State University with a degree in Criminal Justice. Edwards was inducted into the California Community College Sports Hall of Fame in 2017.

Edwards and his wife Lia are the proud parents of three children: Marcus, Gabrielle and Vivian.
